Canada

 Four-year Canadian Bachelor of Social Work degrees, that meet the AASW field education requirements and are accredited by the Canadian Association of Schools of Social Work, are usually assessed as meeting AASW's assessment requirements.

Chile

 would usually be assessed as meeting AASW assessment requirements.
- Instituto Profesional de Santiago (Professional Institute of Santiago) School of Social
 Work: If AASW field education requirements are met, the five year course leading to the award
 of the Titulo Profesional-Trabajo Social is usually assessed as meting AASW assessment
 requirements.

- A Relevant Bachelor degree (e.g. psychology, sociology) followed by two year Master in Social Work (which has generic focus and where AASW field education requirements have been met) is usually assessed as meeting the AASW assessment requirements.
- Where there is specialisation in the second year of a Master of Social Work (or Master of Arts in Social Work) qualifications will have to be assessed on an individual basis.
- 'Non relevant' degree followed by two-year Master in Social Work, to be assessed on an individual basis

Ireland

- University College Cork/National University of Ireland: Master of Social Work or a Post Graduate Diploma in Social Work Studies or a Bachelor of Social Work qualification is usually assessed as meeting the AASW assessment requirements.
- <u>University College Dublin:</u> Master of Social Science in Social Work or a Postgraduate Diploma
 in Social Work qualification is usually assessed as meeting the AASW assessment
 requirements.
- <u>University of Dublin, Trinity College:</u> Master of Social Work or Postgraduate Diploma in Social
 Work or Bachelor of Social Studies with NQSW also awarded qualification is usually assessed
 as meeting the AASW assessment requirements.
- <u>National University of Ireland, Galway:</u> Master of Social Work is usually assessed as meeting the AASW assessment requirements.

Please note that the AASW does not assess social care qualifications. The qualification must be a specific professional qualification in social work.

Netherlands

- Certificate in Social Service (CSS):
- Two-year non-graduate Diplomas in Social Work qualifications
- Three year Bachelor of Social Work qualification:
- Relevant first degree followed by one year postgraduate diploma or master in social work
- Two-year postgraduate diploma/master (with CQSW or DipSW)

United States of America

- Bachelor of Social Work degree which is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE): Individual assessment, such assessments usually recommends for applicants to complete an appropriate study program through an Australian AASW-accredited social work degree course, which will usually include a placement
- Master of Social Work where there was a generic year followed by a concentration year: Where
 the program was accredited by the CSWE at the time of graduation, AND AASW requirements
 for field-work placement were met, AND the Master degree follows relevant Bachelor degree, is
 usually assessed as meeting AASW assessment requirements
- Master of Social Work with concentration in both years: Individual assessment
