

What are the alcohol and other drug-related knowledge, attitudes and practices of recent Social Work graduates?

About	Social workers represent the third-largest segment of the alcohol and other drugs workforce and play a crucial role in supporting individuals facing alcohol and drug problems. This study aims to assess how well recent Australian social work graduates feel prepared to support individuals with alcohol and drug-related problems and is likely to identify avenues for future workforce development.
What is involved	<p>You will be asked to fill out an online survey on the Qualtrics platform. The survey will take about 15 minutes to complete.</p> <p>You will be asked to give basic sociodemographic information about yourself, as well as how much alcohol and other drug training you received in your tertiary social work degree and any other training you have undertaken. You will be asked to complete the 19-item Person-Centred Drug and Drug Problems Perception Questionnaire (PC-DDPPQ). You will also be asked some questions about your stigma toward people with alcohol and other drug problems. There will also be an open-ended question where you can share your opinions on anything you wish you had been taught before undertaking practice as a social worker.</p>
